Dear Siblings in Christ,

As I begin this letter, the sun is out, the fall colors abound on our church property, and I am feeling very grateful for you all. We just had a joyful and delicious community meal this week (if you have never been you really ought to join us in January!) and we had a good showing for our food drive with the Des Moines Area Food Bank. As a church, we like to feed people. And that is priority number one in our local community right now as people wonder if they will receive their SNAP benefits any time soon, as people lose their jobs, as costs just keep going up.

Our theme for stewardship season has been one of generosity and the "gift economy" which is something we already practice a lot of the time in church. Let me share a few words on this by Robin Wall Kimmerer, from her book *The Serviceberry: Abundance and Reciprocity in the Natural World.* 

"In a serviceberry economy, I accept the gift from the tree and then spread that gift around, with a dish of berries to my neighbor, who makes a pie to share with his friend, who feels so wealthy in food and friendship that he volunteers at the food pantry. You know how it goes.

In contrast, if I were to buy a basket of berries in the market economy, the relationship ends with the exchange of money. Once I hand over my credit card, I have no further exchange with the clerk or store. We're done. I own these berries and I can do with them as I'd like."

Kimmerer is really good at putting it plain language transactions do not lead to transformation. But giving, sharing, and generosity does. I want to be part of a world where the natural sharing of our time, talent and treasure leads to more volunteering at the food bank. I want to be part of a community where people believe it matters when we are of service to our neighbors. Church is a place where we can practice this and it lines up really well of Jesus' teaching of loving our neighbors and tangibly showing up for them. As we enter into this month of thanksgiving, as we decide how much we are going to pledge to the church this year, think about how reciprocity and generosity become a lived experience in your life. How does the Holy Spirit guide you to be a generous person? How can you be of service?

Be sure to spend some time in the pages of this newsletter, and be sure to note that Advent begins on Sunday, November 30<sup>th</sup>. We will have a series of Christmas Cantatas with the choir beginning that day and also we'll kick off Advent with an Advent workshop after worship in the Fellowship Hall.

Barbara will be hosting our next luncheon at


Triumph Valley (Chinese), 3750 E Valley Rd, Renton, WA 98057. It's east across the valley and then

Come and join Bob in racing slot cars in the


Fellowship Hall. Fun is had by all! Looking ahead to December, racing will be on the 19th.


